

4 of family from Meerut die in e-way accident

Gurgaon: Four members of a family from Meerut died in an accident in Nuh's Pingawan on the Gurgaon-Dausa stretch of Delhi-Mumbai Expressway as the driver lost control of the car, which smashed into a divider and overturned, on Thursday morning.

Two of the three other passengers in the Ford Ecosport suffered injuries and are critical. Police said the family from Meerut was headed to MP's Ujjain on a pilgrimage and had left their home in Behsuma in the early hours of Thursday.

Around 7am, they had reached Jhimravat village near Pingawan on the Gurgaon-Dausa stretch of the expressway when the car's tyre burst.

"Deepanshu who was driving the car lost control over it when the tyre burst. The car overshot the divider and breached the safety railing before overturning a few times and coming to a halt in the open area next to the road. The car was badly damaged," said inspector Kuldeep Singh of Pingawan police station. Passersby rescued those injured and alerted the authorities. All occupants of the car were rushed to SHKM Medical College and Hospital in Nalhar.

"Anita (44), a housewife, died during treatment. Anita's 19-year-old son Sambhav, a student, and his cousins Deepanshu (29), an employee with a private company, and 12-year-old Piyush died on the spot," the inspector said.

He added that Pushpa (34) and Himanshu (24) are in the ICU, and Geetanshi (17) is stable. Cops said the autopsy was carried out at Al Afia General Hospital in Nuh's Mandikhera, and the bodies were handed over to the family in Meerut. The reports are awaited.

On a complaint by a family member, police on Thursday registered a case under IPC sections 304-A (causing death due to rash or negligent act) and 337 (causing injuries due to rash or negligent act) and 279 (rash driving on a public way). No one is named in the complaint.

Warmest day yet of season, rain expected this evening

New Delhi: The daytime temperature soared further making Friday this year's warmest day till now. However, under the influence of western disturbance, several parts Delhi saw very light rain to drizzling towards late evening along with gusty winds which brought the temperature down quickly.

Indian Meteorological Department (IMD) has issued a yellow alert for very light rain on Saturday evening along with cloudy sky.

On Friday, the maximum temperature was recorded at 37.8 degrees Celsius, five notches above normal - highest this year, against 37 degrees Celsius (second highest) a day earlier. The minimum temperature was recorded at 20.5 degrees Celsius, two notches above normal against 21.2 degrees Celsius a day earlier.

"Due to a fresh western disturbance, several areas of the capital saw strong gusty winds along with very light rain to drizzling in some areas towards late evening. There are chances of very light rain on Saturday as well," said Kuldeep Srivastava, scientist, IMD. **TNN**

2 motorcycle riders hurt in collision in W Delhi

New Delhi: Two motorcycle riders were injured, one of them critically, on Thursday night when a car driven by a 27-year-old man, allegedly under the influence of alcohol, collided with them on Tilak Nagar flyover in west Delhi. No arrest has been made so far as the results of the errant driver's alcohol test were awaited, police said.

After receiving a PCR call around 11.30pm about the accident, a police team rushed to the spot where the car was found rammed into the motorcycle and the injured, Paras (19) and Manpreet (21), were taken to a hospi-

tal, a senior police officer said.

Prima facie, car driver Harkirat, a resident of Tilak Vihar, was found in a drunk condition due to which he had lost control of his vehicle, the officer said, adding, "The impact of the collision had been such that the two-wheeler was found in a mangled condition with its damaged parts stuck on the car's front".

"While Manpreet is stated to be stable, Paras, the pillion driver, has sustained grievous injuries and is said to be in a critical condition," added the officer. **TNN**
